Genius Hour Sparks Innovative Thinking





Students in Mr. Havel's 7th grade social studies classes participate in Genius Hour throughout the year. Students choose a topic of their choice and lead their own learning through research and investigation.

Last year, 7th grade students Hudson S., Dominic T., and Arseny M., participated in one of the IWA enrichment courses, Ancient Greek Triremes. This course challenged the students to design and build a life-size boat that could stay afloat in a body of water. The students were so passionate about the process, that they continued the learning this year as their Genius Hour project. The newly designed trireme was launched locally, with much success!

The video captured was taken by IWA alumnus Anthony Togliatti, Class of 2024, using his drone.

Other projects included:

- Stella J. and Margaret R. researched recipes, learned one of Stella's grandmother's deserts, and then recorded the process.
- Sam M. and Rishica K. researched different mediums of artwork such as chalk, water colors, clay, and more. They then explored and taught the class about their culture and religion through the artwork.
- Abbey O. and Nicolette S. wanted to focus on jewelry. They sent out a survey to their classmates. Based on the results they then planned, designed, and created 18 individual pieces for the class.

Looking ahead, 8th grade students started their Genius Hour process this week. The key to their second Genius Hour is the requirement of having to "create" something new OR "give back" to the community.
