

### **CROSS-CURRICULAR LEARNING**

Second grade students in Mrs. Battaglia's computer class spent time researching animals in quarter one, using their information to code with a program called Scratch. This quarter they continue to research, shifting their focus on the planets. Rather than coding their findings, they will create a PowerPoint presentation that requires them to insert clipart, create titles and text, utilize animation, and present their work.

During their most recent class, the students began this project by researching their planet. Using a graphic organizer provided by the teacher, the students had to answer various facts, as well as create one question they wanted to explore, pertaining to their planet.

There was lots of excitement in the room as the students found out which planet they would be researching throughout this cross-curricular unit! Conversations could be heard in the room amongst the students discussing topics such as Celsius versus Fahrenheit, moons, the order of the planets, and how to recognize



reputable websites that will provide accurate information. Awesome work, second grade!

### STEM Residency at IWA

IWA participated as an Ohio STEM Learning Network (OSLN) residency site for schools enrolled in the OSLN Fostering STEM program, which allows schools who are curious about stem practices to visit designated schools in the state, spending an entire day immersed in their building.

As a part of this program, we hosted many schools from throughout the state on Thursday. The STEM residents engaged in classroom observations, witnessed teacher planning sessions, met with community partner Jeremiah Myers from the Cleveland Museum of Art, and engaged in conversation with our students and faculty.

The residents started the day greeted by our student ambassadors, who were eager to share all of the great things happening at IWA as they led them on a tour throughout the building. Our Girls Who Code club helped the guests create personalized name tags, using unplugged coding.

Overall, the experience was mutually rewarding for our guests and school community, as new relationships were developed and STEM conversations and practices were shared by all!


Resident schools included: Cleveland Metro Schools, St. Martin de Porres, Laurel School, Heartland Christian School, and Southside Academy.
